Our shared commitment to building a better community has brought about tangible and lasting change in the lives of many.

Throughout the past year, your unwavering support has allowed us to embark on significant initiatives, making a profound impact on countless families. Together, we achieved the following milestones:

2 HOUSE BUILDS We completed two house builds, providing safe and secure homes for families in need.

169 EMERGENCY HOME REPAIRS Essential emergency home repairs were completed, positively affecting the lives of 541 people.

3 COMMUNITY CLEAN REVITALIZATION PROJECTS Revitalizing communities and benefiting 12 households and 40 individuals.

- 11 RAMPS CONSTRUCTED Enhancing accessibility for 35 individuals.
- 1. City Code Violation Assistance: Assisted 5 households and 10 individuals in resolving city code violations, ensuring safe and habitable living conditions.
- 2. Family Support and Referrals: 68 individuals received family support and were referred to local community partners to meet their specific needs.
- 3. Homeownership Workshops: Conducted 4 workshops impacting 37 households and 111 individuals, empowering them on the path to homeownership.
- 4. Financial Education: Held 4 in-person classes, benefiting 17 households and 49 individuals, with a total of 328 course certificates awarded.
- 5. Program Certificates: Distributed 22 program certificates to recognize the dedication and achievement of participants.
- 6. Community Access: A total of 4,395 people accessed the services we provided, highlighting the broad and meaningful reach of our organization.

These accomplishments are a testament to the strength of our community and the positive change that can be achieved when we come together. Each house built, every repair made, and all the support extended have not only transformed physical spaces but have also touched the hearts and lives of those we serve.

As we step into the new year, let us carry forward the spirit of compassion, collaboration, and dedication that defines our community. Your continued support fuels our passion to create a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

More than furniture, the Buddy Bench stands against bullying and represents a community supporting its youngest members, imparting lessons about empathy and face-to-face friendship. As children gather around this bench, they are not just sitting; they are building bridges of friendship that will last a lifetime.
