I am Randy Gardner, a 24-year Air Force veteran. Post service, I served 3 years as a budget consultant and the past 5 years in nonprofit senior leadership roles. I was blessed with the opportunity to lead this storied organization a year ago and as I reflect on my first year at the helm, I am in awe of the many achievements your local Habitat team has accomplished. We overhauled the store, added a new box truck and affixed a new wrap to our fleet of trucks (see "Where's the ReStore Truck?" page 2) and expanded our pick-up and delivery area to serve more people by including portions of McClain County. We enhanced our relationship with the City of Norman which enabled a significant number of wheelchair ramp builds for low income families (see Habitat is Building page 3). We shut our doors for nearly two months to confront the challenges of COVID-19 but came back even stronger thanks to an outpouring of support from our donors and customers. We partnered with other local nonprofits to make our community better, stronger, safer because we have always been in this together, long before it became the national catch phrase. We expanded our Board of Directors from six to eleven members and I am blown away by this dedicated group of professionals who elected to give of their time, talent and resources to help ensure the success of our organization (see sidebar for Board members). I am especially excited about the recent groundbreaking and the home we are building for a future habitat family (see below).
